

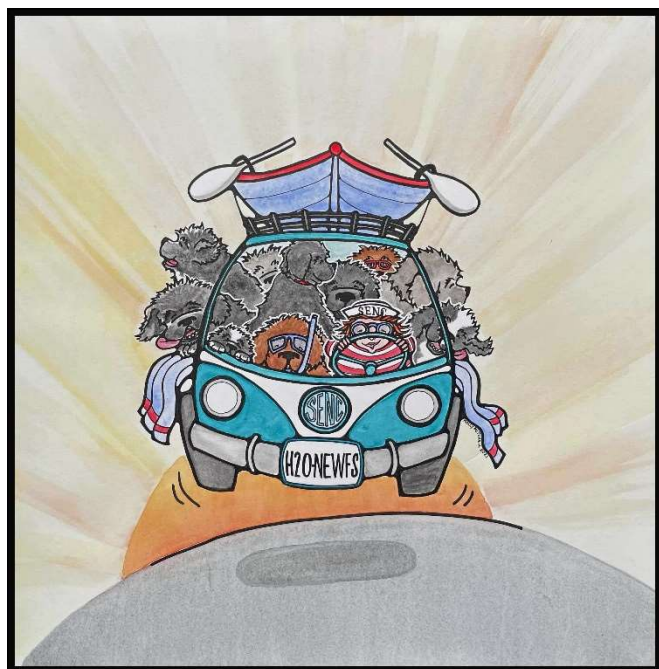

HIGH FALLS COUNTY PARK

High Falls County Park is located in Seneca, SC. The park is on the western shore of Lake Keowee, in Oconee County. An abundance of shore line makes this park an ideal setting. The water is very clear and together with a solid packed bottom, you should see virtually no mud, or silt disruption, during the underwater retrieve. The grade below water drops off gradually and the dogs will be swimming within 20 feet. The water out from the beach is classified as a 'No Wake Zone'.



Two clusters of pine trees offer natural shade. Entrants are encouraged to bring tarps for additional shade. Also, consider bringing a fan for your crated dog, as power and water are available. A very large pavilion will be available and a nearby restroom. A restroom near the entrance of the park provides a changing room and shower facility.

From the Quality Inn: Right at Fatz's Restaurant onto US 123 (Sandifer Blvd.) Go to the 3rd light and left on SC28 (Blue Ridge Blvd.). Right at light on SC188 (Keowee Rd.) and continue on SC188 until it dead ends at SC183 (Pickens Hwy.). Right on SC183 Pickens Hwy. and go 1.7 miles. Right on High Falls Rd. Go about 1.1 miles. Arrive at High Falls Park. Approximate travel time is 25-30 minutes.

From Atlanta, GA: I-85N toward Greenville (Crossing into South Carolina). Take SC-11 exit 1, towards Cherokee Foothills Scenic Parkway/Westminster/Walhalla. Left onto Highway 11/SC-11. Go 23.8 miles. Right onto entrance ramp to Pickens Hwy/SC-183. Left onto Pickens/Hwy/SC-183, go 5.1 miles. Right on High Falls Rd. Park is at end of road.

From Greenville, SC: I-85 South toward Atlanta. Merge onto US-76 W/SC-28 W via Exit 19B toward Clemson. Go 11.2 miles. Left on Tiger Blvd. /US-76 W/US-123 S/SC-28. Go 6.6 miles and turn right onto Rochester Hwy/SC-130. Go 8.7 miles and stay straight to onto Pickens Hwy/SC-183, then go 1.9 and turn sharp left onto High Falls Rd. Park is at the end of the road.

From Asheville, NC: Take I-26 toward I-40. (Stay on I-26 E toward Hendersonville). Go 26.1 miles and merge onto US -25 S via exit 54 toward US-176/NC255/Greenville (crossing into South Carolina). Go 16.3 miles and turn right onto Highway 11/SC-11 (known as Cherokee Foothills Scenic Parkway), toward Cleveland/Gowensville. After 4.5 miles on Hwy 11/SC-11 turn right onto Greer Hwy/US-276W/SC-11. Go approximately 37 miles and take a left onto the entrance ramp to Pickens Hwy/SC-183. Turn left onto Pickens Hwy/SC-183, go 5.1 miles. Turn right onto High Falls Rd. Park is at end of road.

SAFETY RULES

Dogs must be crated or on leash at all times.

- When on leash, the length of the leash must not exceed SIX feet and may NOT be a retractable leash.
- When on leash, dogs must be under control at all times.
- Dogs showing uncontrolled or aggressive behavior will be asked by the event chair, a board member, safety officer or other official to leave the site promptly or be crated for the duration of the event.
- Failure to meet these conditions may result in a disciplinary hearing. There will be occasions when the dog will be allowed off lead when approved by the chairman.

DOGS IN VEHICLES

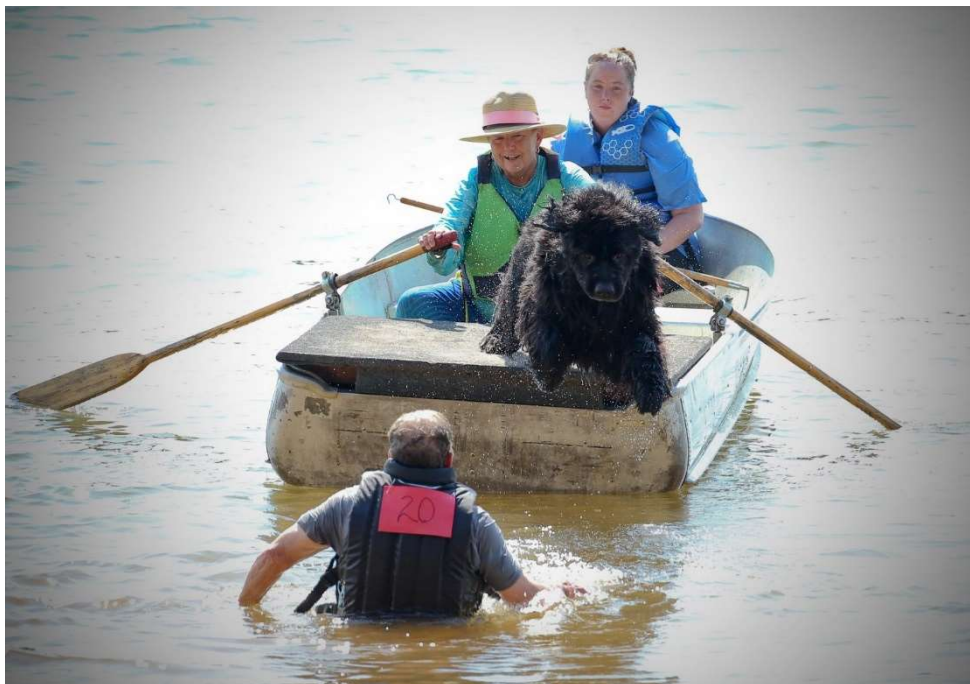
No closed vehicles are allowed with dogs in them. If your dog is in your vehicle, the dog must be confined to a crate with the windows and/or doors open. It is your responsibility to be sure your dog is safe, cool and has plenty of water.

NCA Aggression Policy

Any dog that, in the opinion of the Event Committee, attacks a person or dog at an NCA working event, resulting in an injury, and is believed by that Event Committee to present a hazard to persons or other dogs, shall be disqualified. When the dog is disqualified by the Event Committee pursuant to this section, a report shall be filed with the NCA Board. The disqualified dog may not again compete at any NCA working event, nor be on the grounds of an NCA working event unless and until, following application for reinstatement by the owner to the NCA Board, the owner receives official notification in writing from the NCA Board that the dog's eligibility has been reinstated.

BITCHES IN SEASON OR WITH OVARIAN SPARING SPAY: Bitches in season or ovarian sparing spay will not be allowed on the test site until just prior to being judged, which will be after all other dogs are tested. When not being tested, these bitches must be contained in a designated area away from the official test areas. If you are entering a bitch, do you anticipate she might be in season?

As a courtesy, please inform the Test Secretary prior to the test if your bitch is in season.



PRACTICE TIME The Test Site will be available for practice with a boat on Thursday, October 7, from 2 PM until 5 PM. Friday, October 8 and Saturday, October 9 after 5 PM, at the conclusion of all testing, the site will be available without a boat

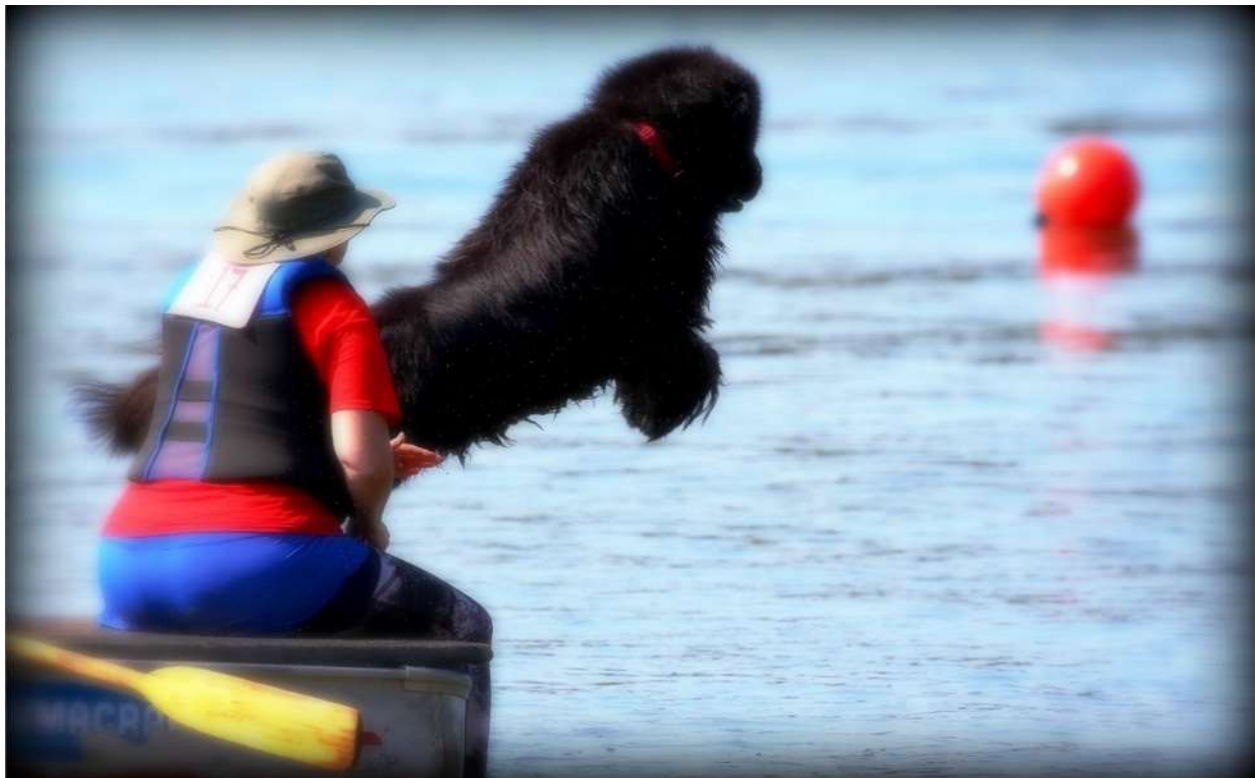
ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS

You may enter Online or via the mail. Entries accepted by Mail must show a verifiable mailing date. To ensure equality between online and manual entries, online entries will be assigned a "postmark date" of the day the data was accepted by the service. If the number of entries exceed the published limits, a lottery to select entrants will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations governing the event. Priority will be given to entrants who have not earned titles in the Division entered.

All entries submitted by mail must include a copy of the dog's current AKC, PAL or foreign registration.

Entry slots will be filled according to postmark date. In the event that the number of entries with the same postmark date received exceeds the limit, entrants and alternates will be determined by a random drawing. Entries received after the entry limit has been reached will be placed on an alternate list in order of postmark. Alternates will be notified immediately should an opening occur.

If any test does not fill with the allotted entries, entries for any other test will be accepted to a maximum of the number published to be judged that day. If any test has more entries than the published maximums, an alternate list will be maintained and a lottery drawing held. ENTRIES POSTMARKED PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATES WILL BE RETURNED



For the Friday WRDX, WD and WRD, WRD Re-Qualification tests,
the maximum number of dogs to be judged will be 25,
With 5 spots reserved for WRDX.

For the Saturday WRDX, WD, WRD, WRD Re-Qualification tests,
the maximum number of dogs to be judged will be 25,
with 5 spots reserved for WRDX.

For the Sunday WD and WRD and WRD Re-Qualification tests,
the maximum number of dogs to be judged will be 25,
Untitled dogs entering for WD, WRD or WRDX will be given priority over
WD/WRD/WRDX Re-Qualifications tests

Entry into Water Test Per the NCA Water Test Regulations, if a dog entered in WD has passed a WD test after the closing of the entries, the entry may be transferred from WD to the WRD Division.

ENTRY FEE IS \$45 FOR EACH DOG EACH DAY

Entries must be postmarked no earlier than August 11, 2021 for NCA Members. Any entries received with a postmark prior to August 11, 2021 will be returned to sender. Non-NCA members must be postmarked no earlier than August 21, 2021.

Entries close and must be received by 11:59 PM on September 18, 2021.

After that date, entries cannot be accepted, canceled/refunded altered or substituted. Entries will be made according to postmark date or date they are entered online. In the event the number of entries from the same date exceeds the limit, vacancies will be filled and alternates will be determined by a random drawing. Entries received after the entry limit has been reached will be placed on an alternate list in the order of the date it was postmarked or received. Alternates will be notified immediately should an opening occur. As space permits, re-qualifiers are welcomed. The SENC will abide by the most recent policy on Accepting and Assigning Entries and Alternates and Refunds as stated in the Newfoundland Water Dog, Water Rescue Dog and Water Rescue Dog Excellent Regulations updated March 2018.

RE-QUALIFICATION FOR WRD

Entrants for Re-Qualifiers will be accepted only if the entry limit is not reached. Dogs that qualify in Senior at a previous test may stay in as Re-Qualifiers, but will be moved to the alternate list (if any). Acceptance into the test(s) will then be based on postmark or online entry date of the original entry.



POST ENTRIES

Dogs that successfully fulfill the requirements for a Junior Division Water Dog title at a test may be post-entered into the Senior Division test and will be tested at the conclusion of the Senior Division judging. The handler will be allowed to test their dog only until it fails an exercise. An additional post-entry fee of \$15 must be given to the Test Secretary at the site at the completion of the Junior Division.

REFUNDS

If an entrant submits an entry to a water test but is not assigned a place in the test, the test secretary must notify the entrant immediately after the closing date and give the entrant the option to be placed on the alternate list. If the entrant chooses not to be on the alternate list, they will receive a full refund. If the entrant chooses to stay on the alternate list but later pulls their entry after the test closing date, they will not receive a refund. Entrants placed on an alternate list will receive a full refund if they do not get into the test, on test day.



EXHIBITORS NOTE Each exhibitor is responsible for knowledge of the official NCA Regulations governing a water test and the applicable standards of performance. A copy of the official Water Test Regulations may be obtained for \$5.00 from the WDC Publications Secretary, Dwight Gorsuch, 6282 Burris Road, Rock Hall, MD 21661. Please make payment to the NCA. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing his/her own test equipment, including a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device and suitable foot protection to be worn in the water.

NCA WORKING EVENT AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that the NCA test regulations have been made available to me (us) and that I am (we are) familiar with their contents. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem to be sufficient. I (we) agree that I(we) will uphold the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, the NCA Code of Ethics, and (if applicable) the NCA Judges Code of Ethics. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold this club, its members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, or test secretary and the owner or lessor of the

premises or grounds and the employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or upon the test premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim or loss of the dog by disappearance, theft, damage or injury, be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person or any other causes. I (we) agree that any violation of the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, the NCA Code of Ethics and/or the Judges Code of Ethics will be handled pursuant to the Grievance policies listed on the NCA website. I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time, resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property, or my vehicle arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this test, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or other persons.

I agree to grant to this club, and its authorized representatives permission to record on photography film and/or video, pictures of my participation. I further agree that any or all of the material photographed may be used, in any form, as part of any future publications, brochure, or other printed materials used to promote NCA or the regional club, and further that such use shall be without payment of fees, royalties, special credit or other compensation.

The Newfoundland Club of America, this regional club, its members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, test committee, reserves the right to remove any animal in distress from a parked car or crate, and all persons attending this dog event hereby waive any claim for damages against the club for such removal. I understand that exposing a dog to an unsafe environment, distress, or harm's way is considered mistreatment and subject to appropriate discipline.
